## Pulitzer Prize for Fiction (Winners or Finalists 2011 – 2010)

### 2011 Winner

*A Visit from the Goon Squad* by Jennifer Egan (Alfred A. Knopf) an inventive investigation of growing up and growing old in the digital age, displaying a big-hearted curiosity about cultural change at warp speed.

### 2011 Finalists

*The Privileges* by Jonathan Dee (Random House) A contemporary, wide ranging tale about an elite Manhattan family, moral bankruptcy and the long reach of wealth.

*The Surrendered* by Chang-rae Lee (Riverhead Books) A haunting and often heartbreaking epic whose characters explore the deep reverberations of love, devotion and war.

### 2010 Winner

*Tinkers* by Paul Harding (Bellevue Literary Press) A powerful celebration of life in which a New England father and son, through suffering and joy, transcend their imprisoning lives and offer new ways of perceiving the world and mortality.

### 2010 Finalists

*Love in Infant Monkeys* by Lydia Millet (Soft Skull Press) An imaginative collection of linked stories, often describing a memorable encounter between a famous person and an animal, underscoring the human folly of longing for significance while chasing trifles.

*In Other Rooms, Other Wonders* by Daniyal Mueenuddin (W.W. Norton & Company) A collection of beautifully crafted stories that exposes the Western reader to the hopes, dreams and dramas of an array of characters in feudal Pakistan, resulting in both an aesthetic and cultural achievement.
