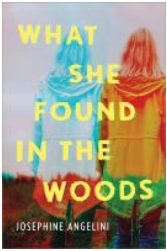


Thrillers and Horror

Books to keep you up at night. Titles marked with an asterisk (*) are less than 300 pages long.

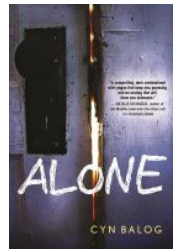


What She Found in the Woods by Josephine Angelini | [YAANG](#)

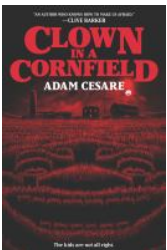
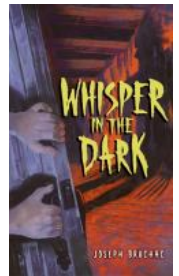


Draw the Dark by Ilsa J. Bick | [YABIC](#)

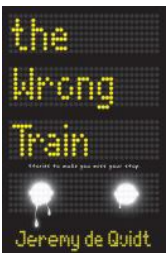


Clown in a Cornfield by Adam Cesare | [YACES](#)

Eleventh grader Jake Livingston fights for survival when the ghost of a school shooter starts to haunt him. (from *Kirkus*)



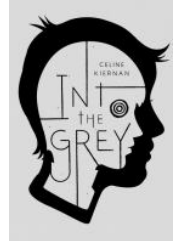


The Glare by Margot Harrison | [YA HAR](#)

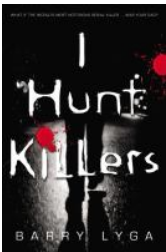


A Taste for Monsters by Matthew J. Kirby | [YA KIR](#)

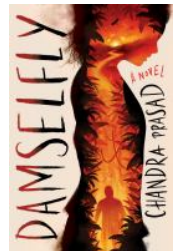


I Hunt Killers by Barry Lyga | [YA LYG](#)

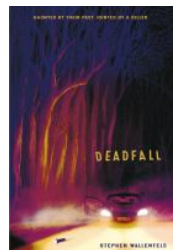


House of Furies by Madeleine Roux | [YA ROU](#)
